Perhaps the only personal effect of Joseph Hillstrom, the disposal of which was directed by the dead man, was a photograph which he had with him in his cell. He ordered it delivered to Hilda Erickson, a young woman whom he knew in Murray and whom he met last at the Eselius home in Murray, where he was arrested.

The picture had come to Hillstrom at the state prison recently from Elizabeth Gurley Flynn of New York, noted leader of the Industrial Workers of the World and a friend of Hillstrom, to whom he sent one of his farewell messages. It was a picture, Hillstrom said, of her little son riding a pony. It seemed to be one of Hillstrom's treasures.

Thursday night he asked that the pic-ture be given to Ed Rohn, chairman of the I. W. W. defense committee, to be given by him to Hilda Erickson. Yesterday morning, when Ed Rohn visited the prison, the photograph, about 5x7 inches in size, was turned over to him. with instructions for its delivery.
