



- 1. The grocery store of J.G. Morrison. Mr. Morrison and son murdered. Surviving Son testified the two intruders shouted "We have got you now."
- 2. Home of Mrs. Vera Hansen. Heard gunshots saw a man leaving the store. Thought she heard the man say "oh Bob." Two men were waiting for him at the intersection.
- 3. Home of Nellie Mahan. Saw man wearing dark coat and soft hat run from the store. Man reportedly said "I'm shot." Man ran to alley in back of her house.
- 4. W.H. Williams found waiting near the grocery store and was arrested. A bloody handkerchief was found in his pocket. Claimed he was staying at Salvation Army House. Eventually released by the police.
- 5. Perry Morrison, eldest son of the slain man. Found some blood in alley near store.
- 6. Police followed a zigzag trail of blood back and forth in an alley near the store.
- 7. Another blood trail found on 1st West Street that led to railroad tracks near 10th South Street.
- 8. Arthur Gardner located another blood trail. Police followed it to Oregon Short Line Railroad tracks at 12th South Street. Found what appeared to be a bloody hand mark in the snow.
- 9. Followed blood to Denver and Rio Grande railroad yard. Discovered the charred coals of a recent fire. Besides coals, Patrolman Crosby found two empty 38-caliber revolver cartridges, one of which was apparently bloodstained.
- 10. A streetcar conductor, J.R. Usher, reported that a suspicious-looking man had boarded his streetcar at tenth south at 11:26 the night of the murders. The man wore a dark suit and a black hat.
- 11. Man left streetcar. Later identified from a police photograph by Usher as Frank Z. Wilson (ex-convict that had been arrested by Morrison).
- 12. Peter Rhengren claimed he saw a man lying in a ditch at eighth west and eighth south at about 11:30 Saturday night. When he offered to help, he said, the man got out of the ditch and ran to an approaching streetcar.
- 13. Mrs. Phoebe Seeley, while coming home from the Empress theatre, saw two men in a back street in the vicinity of the Morrison store. One of them had sharp features and light bushy hair.
- 14. Office of Dr. Frank M. McHugh. Treated Joe Hill at 11:30 pm, the night of the murders.
- 15. The Corner of 800 South and West Temple [a close-up].
